Babati Town Council (BTC) represents one of the fastest growing towns (cities of tomorrow) in Tanzania. We worked in the Babati Town Council on multiple tasks including developing formative and baseline information on the state of water and Sanitation access, profiles and their eventual interactions. The results revealed an interaction of the water and sanitation facilities, the shit flow diagram indicated that the largest part of the fecal sludge management is not safely managed, the domestic water handling patterns indicated possibility for cross contamination, emerging contaminants in the groundwater needs a second eye in order to prevent contamination and the public and community toilets are not friendly. It is possible to intervene and increase the access to water and sanitation in such settings to the beneficiaries. Several interventions are currently underway following this reporting.
